BEFORE AND AFTER CARE PROGRAMS



DePaul parents have schedules jam packed with work and community activities, so we have expanded dropoff/pickup times for the kids.

Before Care

Drop your child off at DePaul as early as 7:45 AM at no charge. If you need an earlier dropoff time, our doors open to students in the Before Care program at 6:45 AM each school day. It's \$40 monthly to enroll your child in Before Care. If you need Before Care for a single day, it's just a \$5 drop-in charge.

Homework Assistance

Our school day ends at 3:15, which opens up the afternoon to give students a learning boost in a more relaxed environment. We've designed a short, productive study block during which DePaul teachers are available to explain concepts and answer questions. Homework Assistance ends promptly at 4:00 PM, and it's available for \$125 per quarter. Children left at DePaul after 4:00 PM automatically enter the Extended Day program

Extended Day Program

Our Extended Day Program is available every school day from 3:30 PM until 5:30 PM. If your child is not picked up by 4:00 PM, he or she will automatically go into this program at a drop-in rate of \$10 per day. Our teachers give the children a snack, ensure their homework is done, and supervise their play time until you pick them up. Extended Day is \$140 per month for enrolled students.

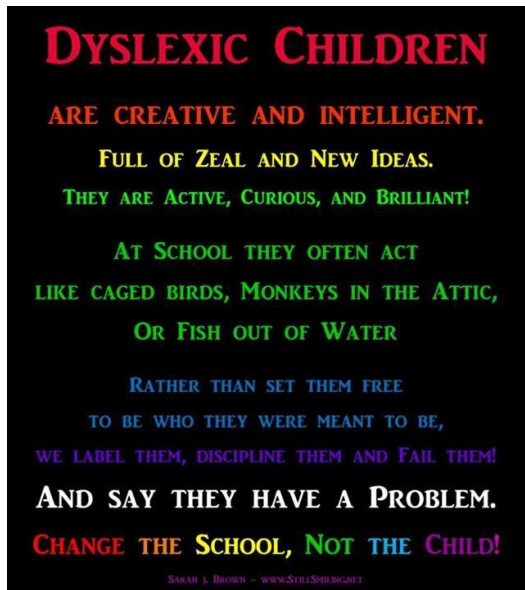
