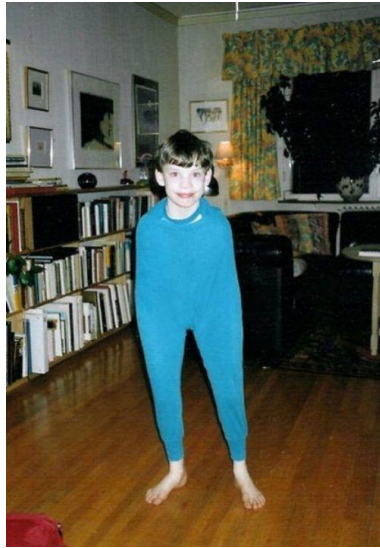

DRESS IT UP, DRESS IT DOWN



The DePaul School is an environment where students focus more on problem solving, reading, and learning history than fashion. Here are some basics of wearing a DePaul uniform:
