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

SCHOOL PICTURE DAY

1. No radical changes. Picture day is the perfect time to pull out the favorite shirt that always looks great. We relax the dress code a bit

for pictures, so a different shirt is fine for the sitting. (The students simply change back into uniforms afterward.)

2. Wait on that haircut.

If your child needs a haircut, it's best to wait until after his/her picture session. Fresh haircuts can look severe on camera, and hair changes can set your kid up for a bad hair day. Long hair looks better than both.

3. No gooey, gloopy breakfasts or snacks.
